John 18:1-27 Study Guide (NKJV)

Scriptures in Study Guide:

Scriptures (NKJV) are within the daily lessons to make things simpler for the fill in the blank areas. You will use your Bible for other areas so I would encourage you to have it physically with you when you do your daily lesson. If you have any questions, write them down and we'll discuss them when we meet Sunday mornings at 9:45 am.

Lesson format:

- 1. **Pray** that God will open your heart and eyes to see what He wants to teach you.
- 2. **Do the lessons daily.** I encourage you to schedule a time to do them. If we don't, though, make it a priority then our busyness will rob us of this time with God. (Matthew 13:22). We have to be intentional.
- 3. Read the scripture for the day out loud (like we do together). There is something about us "hearing' ourselves read that helps us remember.

Jesus said to them, "I am He." And Judas, who betrayed Him, also stood with them. 6 Now when He said to them, "I am He," they drew back and fell to the ground.

	Context Background:
•	At this point in history, the high priest was more like an office that someone held and Malchus was his servant. Jesus, as seen in John 17's prayer as well as what Jesus was about to accomplish on the cross, was the ultimate High Priest (see Hebrews 9:12).

•	Context Background: In the Old Testament, a "cup" was viewed as God's Divine wrath. This wrath would be poured out on Jesus, as God's Son, on the cross to pay for every sin that would be committed. God treated Jesus on the cross as if He were the sinner. And we, as God's children through our faith in Jesus as God's Son and His payment of our sins upon the cross, are treated as if we have lived the righteousness of Jesus Christ. This is known as Imputation ("humanity's sins are imputed to Christ and Christ's righteousness is imputed to believers, essentially making it theirs before God. "). This privilege, though, is only reserved for those who recognize the Father through His Son, Jesus and His death upon the cross. The only unforgivable sin is rejecting God's Son since an unsaved person must account for their own sins instead of Jesus Christ covering them with His blood on the cross. And there is no way a human person can meet the standard of Deity without Jesus Christ. And once we are saved, Jesus becomes our Lord. It must be both (He saves us from our sins and becomes our Lord). We, ourselves, would never purchase something to own and then be okay with the seller to continue to do what they wanted with what we bought. It is ours. And we are His. As Jesus said "He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him." (John 14:21)

Context Background:

This verse refers back to **John 11:49-50**: "But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all. Nor do you understand that it is better for you that one man should die for the people, not that the whole nation should perish." This was a response when the Jewish leaders began to plot Jesus' death. God did put these words in Caiaphas' mouth. Unfortunately, based upon Caiaphas' involvement within this mock trial and subsequent murder of Jesus, Caiaphas didn't understand the fullness of what he had spoken.

•	In Luke 22:34, what does Jesus tell Simon Peter that he will do?
•	Luke 22:61-62 gives a personal account of what happened fully between Jesus and Simon Peter in that last of those 3 denials. What happened?
•	Now the good news - God never leaves a sinner where they are if they are truly seeking Him. In John 21:15-25, how many times did Jesus ask Peter if he loved Him and then gave Peter direction in what his work for God would be? The same as each denial.
