<u>Day 1</u>

Read John 20:1-18 out loud and summarize what happened below:

19 Then, the same day at evening, being the first <i>day</i> of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace <i>be</i> with you." 20 When He had said this, He showed them <i>His</i> hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord.

Day 3 - Forgiveness (Christly love)

For today's study, we're going to focus on how Jesus loved. Many times in the world, defines "love" as letting someone have what they want or not holding them accountable for breaking God's commands. The Scriptures, however, never show Jesus allowing a person to break God's commands (sin) in order for the person to feel loved. With the woman at the well (**John 4**), Jesus confronted her sin before He disclosed Himself as the Messiah to her. When Nicodemus came to Jesus with questions (**John 3**), He confronted Nicodemus' religious system (**John 3:10-11**) to expose his rebellion against God. It wasn't until after the crucifixion that we see a surrendered Nicodemus that is resolved to leave all to follow Christ. A person must recognize they're a sinner. One cannot recognize that if we make them comfortable in their sin. Once a person recognizes their sin and their inability to pay for it, they will begin to seek a Savior Who can take that repentance and forgive (**1 John 1:9**).

Read Luke 23:32-34 out loud and answer the related questions:

32 Two other men, both criminals, were also led out with him to be executed. **33** When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals—one on his right, the other on his left. **34** Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." And they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

Read Luke 23:39-43 out loud and answer the related questions:
39 One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" 40 But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? 41 We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man ha done nothing wrong." 42 Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." 43 Jesus answered him, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise."
Questions:
 In Luke 23:40-41, do you think the "other criminal" is recognizing his sin? If so, what makes you think that way?
• Remember that this follows them hearing Jesus praying for His persecutors from the cross. What does the "other criminal" do after acknowledging what he did was wrong and that his punishment was just; but not Jesus'?
• What is Jesus response to the "other criminal" in Luke 23:43 ? What would we say Jesus is doing for this man?

Jesus came, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, "Peace to you!" **27** Then He said to Thomas, "Reach your finger here, and look at My hands; and reach your hand *here*, and put *it* into My side.
