

1John Study Guide - 1John 5 (New International Version)

Review:

Ch. 1. - The apostle John begins his letter to the church by reminding them of Jesus' Deity (He is God) and how that knowledge sheds light on who they are within Him. If they are of Jesus, they must walk like Jesus and not the world. If they live like the world, then they are not of God and His truth isn't really in them. They must examine their hearts. If they recognize that they are not truly saved, they must confess and repent so that Jesus will cleanse them.

Ch. 2. - Jesus is our Advocate and the One Who paid for our sin. This should bring us comfort that our faith in Jesus Christ frees us from the penalty of sin. The apostle John explains how their actions can demonstrate where their faith is at that point. Do they keep God's commands (i.e. follow what the Scriptures say)? If not, then they lie to themselves that they are a Christian. In order to walk like Jesus did when He was on this earth, we must abide in Him (i.e. be in His Word daily and pray). John refreshes the old command of loving one's brother/sister by saying that if we hate them, the love of God can't be present within us. This will lead us to darkness by drawing us away from God and closer to the world's ways. John cautions the church to beware of those against Christ ("anti"-christs) since we're living in the last "hour" (that "hour" began at the cross and indicates an "era").

Ch. 3 - John begins to explain the privilege of being God's child and to not be surprised that the world does not like us. Our will (either self-will or submitted will) exposes the genuineness of who our "parent" truly is (the world or God)? John reminds the church the world is passing away and that it doesn't like us because we are God's children. John then goes on to define God's love and explains that if we are of God, this type of love will be manifested within us.

Ch. 4 - John continues his discussion on the one who is of God is the one who keeps God's commandments and loves others. This love of others would never be in violation of what God commands. It is a love that denies self and glorifies God by keeping His Word. When we love in this way, we demonstrate Whose we are and make God real to others. John cautions believers to "test" those around to see if they are false teachers. Those who uphold or promote anything that opposes what God's Word says are false and doesn't confess that Jesus is God. If we follow God's Word by our life choices it shows that we are God's and are protected from the day of judgement and can be unafraid of punishment. Our hearts toward others should always be a love from the heart that will long for the redemption of others to Christ no matter what they have done. Not that they continue in their sin; but they repent of it to seek forgiveness from God through His Son, Jesus Christ. Our love of others in this way shows our love of God. God desires none to perish; but all to come to repentance. (2 Peter 3:9)

Day 3 - Various Scriptures

Today, we'll study how all 3 (water, blood, Spirit) testified that Jesus was Deity. I have NIV translation here, but you are welcome to look at your own personal translation, if you would like to compare.

Jesus' baptism in **Matthew 3:13-18**:

13 Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. **14** But John tried to deter him, saying, “I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?” **15** Jesus replied, “Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness.” Then John consented.

16 As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. **17** And a voice from heaven said, “This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased.”

As we move through this passage (compare **Mark 1:10-11** and **Luke 3:21-22**), we see the Triune - God, the Father (1st in the Triune), Jesus, God the Son (2nd in the Triune) and the Holy Spirit, the Power of God (3rd in the Triune) in perfect agreement/unity bearing witness of Jesus' Deity at His water baptism.

Let's now look at **Jesus' crucifixion** (He, as God, shed His human blood for our sin debt):

- in **Matthew 27:54**:

54 When the centurion and those with him who were guarding Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified, and exclaimed, “Surely he was the Son of God!”

- in **John 20:25-27** (after Jesus was resurrected):

25 So the other disciples told him, “We have seen the Lord!” But he said to them, “Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.” **26** A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you!” **27** Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe.”
