

Acts 2:25-47 Study Guide

Background: In your previous study guide of **Acts 2**, you walked through the **first 24 verses** of chapter 2. The time is Pentecost, also known as Feast of Weeks or Feast of Harvest. It occurs 50 days after the Passover celebration. The location is Jerusalem. According to **Acts 1:3**, Jesus spent 40 days teaching, after His resurrection from the dead, and showing tangible proof of His resurrected body to His disciples. As all of them were together praying in the place that Jesus had told them to be, a sound of a wind comes and they are filled with the knowledge of God in languages beyond the Hebrew and the Aramaic that God's Word had been spoken in previously. This is a sign of judgement on Israel that no longer would they be the only ones who will be God's agent to bring knowledge of God to the world. "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!" (**Matthew 23:37**) The gentiles, us, are the "other sheep" that Jesus must bring in. (**John 10:16**). The church is begins to be built through Jesus' eye-witnesses. Peter raises up to explain the beginning of the fulfillment of Joel's prophecy as well as showing how Jesus Christ, the very One they just killed 50 days before this, was their Messiah. Peter will continue to show these "devout Jews" through Old Testament Scriptures how Jesus is the Son of God and is their only Hope of Salvation.

Acts 2:42 is an outline of what the church (the body of Christ) follows today.

- **Apostles teachings** - this is the New Testament that was written down by them as Jesus taught them throughout those 3 1/2 years and then during those 40 days in **Acts 1**.
- **Fellowship** - this is our gathering together (congregational and in smaller groups)
- **Breaking of the bread** - Communion
- **Prayer** - corporately, small groups and individually (all of these)

Wonders and signs are not God and shouldn't be sought in that way. They, instead, point to the truth of God -that He is Who He says He is.
