In class, we'll go into more of the significance of this scripture's fulfillment in **Zechariah 12:10** as well as it's relevance to the full restoration of Israel to God through Jesus (**Revelation 1:7**).

38 After this, Joseph of Arimathea, being a disciple of Jesus, but secretly, for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus; and Pilate gave *him* permission. So he came and took the body of Jesus.

Let's look what the other gospels tell us about Joseph of Arimathea:
Matthew 27:57-60 - "57 Now when evening had come, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who himself had also become a disciple of Jesus. 58 This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be given to him. 59 When Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, 60 and laid it in his new tomb which he had hewn out of the rock; and he rolled a large stone against the door of the tomb, and departed.
• Question: In Matthew 27:57 above, what do we learn about Joseph's financial status?
Mark 15:43-46 - "43 Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent council member, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, coming and taking courage, went in to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. 44 Pilate marveled that He was already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him if He had been dead for some time. 45 So when he found out from the centurion, he granted the body to Joseph. 46 Then he bought fine linen, took Him down, and wrapped Him in the linen. And he laid Him in a tomb which had been hewn out of the rock, and rolled a stone against the door of the tomb.
 Questions: In Matthew 27:57 above, what do we learn about Joseph of Arimathea's position with the Jewish council? What do you think that it means that Joseph of Arimathea was a "prominent" council member?
<u>Luke 23:50-53</u> - "50 Now behold, <i>there was</i> a man named Joseph, a council member, a good and just man. 51 He had not consented to their decision and deed. <i>He was</i> from Arimathea, a city of the Jews, who[a] himself was also waiting for the kingdom of God. 52 This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. 53 Then he took it down, wrapped it in linen, and laid it in a tomb <i>that was</i> hewn out of the rock, where no one had ever lain before.

Day 4 -Read John 19:39 out loud and complete verses:

39 And Nicodemus, who at first came to Jesus by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pounds.

Nicodemus is only mentioned in the gospel of John. Remember that John's gospel was written at the end of John's life. Threats that may have existed to people publicly professing Christ could've been more overwhelming in the early years when Matthew, Mark and Luke were written. For the remainder of Day 4, let's step back to review what we have learned about Nicodemus from John's gospel.

John 7: 45-53 - "45 Then the officers came to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why have you not brought Him?" 46 The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this Man!"47 Then the Pharisees answered them, "Are you also deceived? 48 Have any of the rulers or the Pharisees believed in Him? 49 But this crowd that does not know the law is accursed."50 Nicodemus (he who came to Jesus]by night, being one of them) said to them, 51 "Does our law judge a man before it hears him and knows what he is doing?"52 They answered and said to him, "Are you also from Galilee? Search and look, for no prophet has arisen out of Galilee."

Day 5 -Read John 19:40-42 out loud and complete verses:

40 Then they took the body of Jesus, and bound it in strips of linen with the spices, as the custom of the Jews is to bury. **41** Now in the place where He was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. **42** So there they laid Jesus, because of the Jews' Preparation *Day*, for the tomb was nearby.

The world questions Scripture's authenticity. Scripture validates itself. Jesus said in **John 14:29**, that He told things before they happened so that when they did, we would believe. And the apostle John says in **John 20:31** that these signs of fulfilled Scripture testify to the Deity of Jesus so that in believing in the signs and the One these signs point to, we may have eternal life. Today's Scriptures are one of many fulfillments of Isaiah 53. As we conclude Day 5, read through **Isaiah 53** and then focus on verse 9.

1 Who has believed our report? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? 2 For He shall grow up before Him as a tender plant, And as a root out of dry ground. He has no form or comeliness; And when we see Him, There is no beauty that we should desire Him. 3 He is despised and rejected by men, A Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. 4 Surely He has borne our griefs And carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted. 5 But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed. 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way; And the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all. 7 He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, And as a sheep before its shearers is silent, So He opened not His mouth. 8 He was taken from prison and from judgment, And who will declare His generation? For He was cut off from the land of the living; For the transgressions of My people He was stricken. 9 And they made His grave with the wicked — But with the rich at His death, Because He had done no violence, Nor was any deceit in His mouth. 10 Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise Him; He has put Him to grief. When You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days, And the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand. 11 He shall see the labor of His soul, and be satisfied. By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many, For He shall bear their iniquities. 12 Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the great, And He shall divide the spoil with the strong, Because He poured out His soul unto death, And He was numbered with the transgressors, And He bore the sin of many, And made intercession for the transgressors.
